- The New HIV Vaccine and Microbicide Advocacy Society is a national focused non-governmental organization which started operations in Nigeria in 2003 with the aim of ensuring prompt access biomedical HIV prevention tools as soon as it is developed.
- Its mission is to advocate for, invest in, and support efforts to reduce the HIV incidence through the use of evidence based research derived responses.
- It works with different international, regional and national stakeholders (policy makers, regulatory agencies, researchers, journalists, civil society) to achieve these goals.



- We have alliances with advocates and lobbyists around the world who have made significant game changing and life impacting advocacies for biomedical HIV prevention research, development and uptakes of finished products.
